I want to start by thanking everyone who supported our program in 2023. We had great achievements that I am delighted to share with you.

From the residents' side, our 1<sup>st</sup>-year students (Elisabeth Crowe, Jessica Jiang, DDS '22, Justin Mack, and Iman Shirmohammadi, DDS '23) started strong, and enjoying the basic science and clinical courses during the summer. Their typodond course was reformulated with many new wire bending exercises. Thus far they have been assigned nearly 50 new patients each, and the list of assignments is growing. They had the opportunity to attend the GORP meeting in Ann Arbor and the MASO meeting at the National Harbor this year, and the travel expenses were supported by our division.

All 3rd-year residents (Kevin Barnes, DDS '21, Lindsay Diaz, DDS '21, Vicente Telles da Silva, Emily Wu) are working to finish their master thesis research. They all passed their ABO written examination, with good grades. Kevin Barnes '21, Tri Le '22 and Christina Grace will attend the AAO New and Younger Members in San Antonio, TX; while Lindsay will attend the Advocacy meeting in Washington, DC next February/24 representing MASO.
